Rick Kenney made his career in sport and leisure for some 40 years, working as Assistant Director of Leisure Services at Motherwell District Council; Director of Leisure & Community Support Services at Inverclyde Council; CEO of JudoScotland and Sport & Recreation Manager with Scottish Borders Council, retiring in July 2011.

A qualified physical education teacher with an MBA degree, Rick is a former two-term Vice Chair of the Commonwealth Games Council for Scotland involved in the bid process for Glasgow 2014. Rick was Scottish Assistant General Team Manager at the Commonwealth Games in Kuala Lumpur in 1998 and Melbourne 2006 and Depute General Team Manager at Manchester in 2002 and is currently President of the Commonwealth Judo Association and Vice President of JudoScotland.

A 7th Dan in judo, Rick is a former multiple Scottish and British Champion and competed for many years in both judo and wrestling. After retiring he coached many judo players over the years and was the Coach to the successful judo team at the Auckland Commonwealth Games in 1990 when judo made its first appearance in the Games. He was given life membership of Judo Scotland in 2012.

He is currently involved in a number of Borders sports groups - Chair of the Borders Athlete Support Programme; Chair of ClubSport Borders, the umbrella group for the 4 local ClubSport groups; Chair of the Borders Elite Swim Team (BEST) and is a Director of Volunteer Centre Borders. He was the ClubSport Ettrick & Lauderdale SALSC Service to Sport Award winner in 2013; received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Scottish Ethnic Minority Sports Association in 2017 and was the recipient of the Scottish Borders Celebration of Sport Award for Services to Sport in 2018.

Rick has been a member of local sports councils in Hamilton, Motherwell, Inverclyde and the Scottish Borders since 1982 and is currently Vice Chair of ClubSport Ettrick and Lauderdale in the Scottish Borders. He is the current Scottish Clubsport Equality Champion, Vice Chair and Chair of the Administration Working Group. Rick wants to continue working to improve our services to member sports councils and partners and seeks your support for the forthcoming 2020 election for the position of Chair of Scottish ClubSport.
